Rural Conservation Program

● Prepare conservation farm/land management plans for farmers and other land users to help them implement ag BMPs designed to reduce non-point source pollution and improve water quality and meet requirements of Federal, State, and local government programs including:

● Administer VA Ag BMP Cost-Share Program to help farmers and land users pay for costs incurred in implementation of BMPs designed to improve water quality and quantity of surface and ground water, control point source and nonpoint source pollution, and prevent erosion.

VA Ag BMP Cost-Share paid 2010: \$ 305,786.46, including carryover funds.

TMDL Ag Cost-Share paid 2010: \$ 61,795.44

TMDL Residential Cost-Share paid 2010: \$ 81,558.15

- Provide/sponsor special programs for teachers/educators.

As a part of Loudoun Environmental Stewardship Alliance, the District organized 2 environmental education teacher workshops for Loudoun teachers. Assisted in obtaining a \$1,000 grant for the LESA program.

- Provide and administer mini-grant program for teachers/educators for projects to enhance environmental science education programs.

Mini-grants were awarded to: Potowmack Elementary, Forest Grove Elementary, and Seneca Ridge Middle School.

- Provided 29 conservation education classroom programs to Loudoun elementary school students .

- Support and help to organize Earth Day and Arbor Day celebrations. Earth Day at Loudoun was held April 25, 2010 in Broadlands and the Arbor Day Celebration was held April 24, 2010 at Morven Park.

- Develop and distribute fall/winter newsletter to more than 3500 cooperators and other interested individuals plus an Annual Report is available on the website.

- Prepare and submit articles to local news media as warranted/needed. District information is now included on the District website, www.loudounsoilandwater.org and the District Facebook page.

- Provide education materials to teachers, at no cost, for special programs such as Soil and Water Stewardship Week.

2010 S&W Stew. Week: materials sponsored by County School Board; 8,588 materials distributed to 37 schools by the District.

- Awarded a scholarship to a Loudoun student to attend Youth Conservation Camp.

- Sponsor annual Tree Seedling Sale, 12 Rain Barrel Workshops to encourage conservation awareness and to raise funds for the District Environmental Education Program.

- Participate in 4-H Ag Day. The soil tunnel was on display with students participating in a soils activity and constructing soil tubes.

- Hosted Catocin TMDL Final Meeting.

- Participated in Loudoun Valley High School Career Fair. Spoke to students about agriculture and conservation.

- Assisted with Extension/Virginia State University High Tunnel Raspberry grant proposal.

- Participated in the Loudoun County Science Fair. The District sponsored 3 awards and staff served as judges.

- This year the District was awarded "Education District of the Year" by the Virginia Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts. The District received a plaque and recognition at the VASWCD Annual Meeting.
