## Mark Your Calendar for the First Loudoun SEAS...

The inaugural Loudoun Student Environmental Action Showcase (SEAS) will be held on **Tuesday, March 26, 2019, from 5-8 p.m. at Heritage High School in Leesburg, Virginia.** The event is co-hosted by Loudoun County Public Schools (LCPS), the Loudoun Environmental Stewardship Alliance (LESA), and the Northwest Virginia Regional GREENetwork.

The highlight of the event will be student-created exhibitions of environmentally-themed projects and ongoing activities. Individual students, green/eco-action teams, environmental clubs and youth groups are invited to share their work on reducing waste, conserving energy, improving water quality, preserving natural habitat and other sustainability-minded projects in their schools and communities.

Participation is open to all K-12 students in Loudoun County representing public and private schools, homeschoolers and members of community-based youth organizations such as 4-H clubs and Scout troops.

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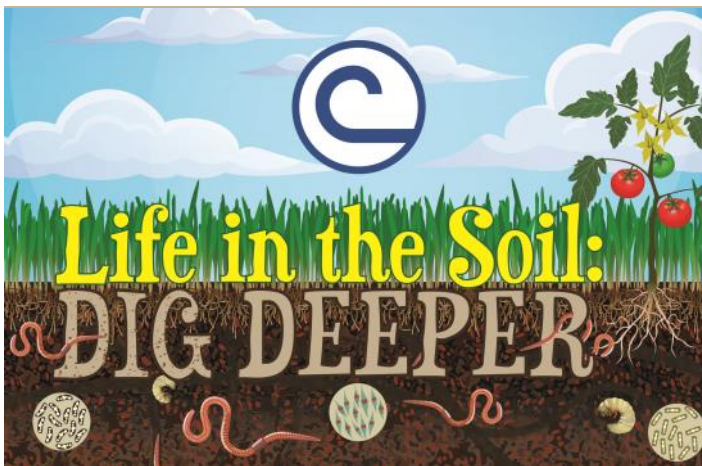

# April 28 – May 5, 2019

As a part of the Loudoun community, the Loudoun SWCD wants to remind you that each of us has a connection to natural resources. The National Association of Conservation Districts (NACD) is celebrating Stewardship week April 28–May 5, 2019. The Stewardship and Education Committee has developed a five-year rotation for stewardship topics – water, soil, habitat, forestry, and a topic of interest – and determines the theme each year. **The 2019 Stewardship theme is Life in the Soil: Dig Deeper.**

Water is one of our most precious resources. Watersheds supply water for drinking and recreation, irrigation and manufacturing, and wildlife and bird habitat. It is essential that each of us adopts good water conservation habits so that we can keep our water resources safe and productive now and for future generations.

This year the Loudoun SWCD in partnership with Loudoun County Public Schools will continue its special stewardship education program for local elementary and middle schools by providing printed educational materials. 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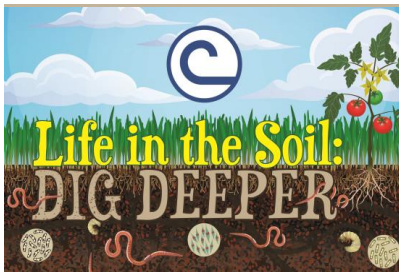


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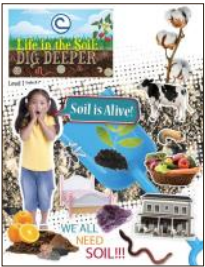
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# 2019 Soil & Water Stewardship Week Class Materials

## Activity Books



### Life in the Soil: Dig Deeper Level 1 (GR K-1)

Designed for students in grades K-1.

#### TOPICS:

- ~ Familiarize themselves with the ways they interact with soil on a daily basis.
- ~ Differentiate between living and nonliving components of soil.
- ~ Realize the connection between soil and items such as food, furniture, etc.

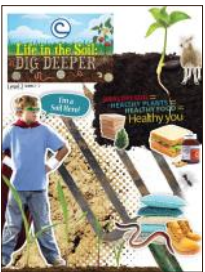


### Life in the Soil: Dig Deeper Level 4 (GR 6 and up)

Designed for students in grades 6 and up.

#### TOPICS:

- ~ Explain the role of soil microbes.
- ~ Distinguish the difference between types of soil microbes.
- ~ Recognize the involvement of soil in most aspects of daily life.
- ~ Comprehend the value of healthy soil. Identify the structure and function of soil profiles.



### Life in the Soil: Dig Deeper Level 2 (GR 2-3)

Designed for students in grades 2-3.

#### TOPICS:

- ~ Identify the connection between the five senses and the comfort of their living environment.
- ~ Recognize that many living organisms make their home in soil.
- ~ Realize the connection between soil and their daily activities.



### Life in the Soil: Dig Deeper Level 3 (GR 4-5)

Designed for students in grades 4-5.

#### TOPICS:

- ~ Recognize that millions of organisms are living in the soil around them.
- ~ Relate classifications of soil organisms to their function within the soil.
- ~ Appreciate the benefit of soil and soil organisms to humans.
- ~ Identify the structure and function of soil horizons.
